Mike Sangster Letter

The last newsletter carried news of the death of Rudolf Brazda, the last surviving veteran of the Pink Triangles - gay men who were imprisoned in Nazi death camps (lesbians were assigned black triangles, and were lumped in with prostitutes and other "anti-social" women).

Long-time activist Mike Sangster has sent in these thoughts :

“Just the other day I was talking to a friend about the Nazi death camps and how as they were liberated at the end of the war the prisoners with the ‘pink triangle’ were the only prisoners left in the camps as they were considered ‘real criminals’ not worthy of liberation by many of their liberators. With Rudolf Brazda’s death goes the last living testament of the horrible time in human history. Certainly it is up

to all of us in our community to never forget his and his fellow ‘pink triangles’ sacrifice. We must always be vigilant even now because there are those who would love nothing more than to place us all into concentration camps.

Some out there in our own community say, ‘Why do we still need a Pride Parade?’ Rudolf’s life is one reason for sure.”

Homosexual acts between consenting adults remain illegal in about 70 countries around the world, with penalties ranging from very mild to the death penalty. The struggle is far from over.

Do you have a chronic health condition? Health professions students

are looking for volunteers for the Dalhousie Health Mentors program. You meet three or four times during the academic year with a mixed team of four students from different programs (e.g. nursing, dentistry, social work, etc). They will discuss with you what it is like to live with your condition, and what difficulties you have faced in dealing with the health care system. Yes, you can decline to answer specific questions if you wish. Orientation with your fellow resource people is September 1, 2011, but you need to register as a mentor in advance (see below). After orientation, a member of your student team will get in touch to organize a meeting, which might be at Dalhousie or at a coffee shop or even in your home.
