

11- Recounting Church Abuse.

Rainbow Communion is the special LGBTQI Listening Committee of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Its mandate is to offer a safe and respectful, confidential environment in order to encourage people to tell stories of harm done to them within and by the church because of homophobia, heterosexism and transphobia; and

to share stories of God's grace experienced by them and through them in Christian ministry, even in the midst of challenges they have faced.

The Listening Committee consists of 7 members drawn from across the church reflecting the diversity of the denomination and includes 2 members who identify as LGBTQI.

Two members of the Listening Committee will be available in Atlantic Canada May 10, 11, 12 to meet with any who wish to tell their story.
