The Elderberries has been listed in the Nova Scotia 211 directory since 2015. **211 Nova Scotia** is a free helpline that connects people to community and social services in your area 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. They have a website as well, but since 2015, they have made 6 referrals to Elderberries:

- Direct requests for the number for Elderberries
- A call from an individual who was 50+ who identified as bisexual and was looking for an opportunity to talk to others who identify as LGBT
- Service provider was looking for an LGBT advocacy group for a client who is a senior
- Caller is a senior looking for services specific to the LGBT community
- Caller was looking for supports for a 50 year old who has recently come out

7 — Raspberry Elderflower Mocktail

Ingredients: ¹/₂ cup fresh raspberries • ¹/₃ cup elderflower syrup • 1 cup *each* cranberry juice & apple juice • ice cubes • 1 lime, sliced

Method: Mash raspberries using a mortar and pestle or fork. In a cocktail shaker, shake elderflower syrup, juices, and $\frac{1}{3}$ of the berry puree. Pour over ice in a tall glass and top with remaining puree. Garnish with a slice of lime.
