March 7 : Global Day of Action against Homophobia in Nigeria: the Solidarity Alliance, Nigeria, calls for a day of protest against the new Same-Sex Marriage Prohibition Bill and the Anti-same-sex Law.

Late February : President Yoweri Musevani of Uganda signs into law the Anti Homosexuality Bill. The next day, Ugandan tabloids publish lists (some with photos) of persons in Uganda believed to be LGBTI.

Early February : Protesters at a demonstration against internet censorship in Taksim, Turkey, were tear-gassed, and many arrested. Sezer Yekta was taken into custody for being in possession of a rainbow flag. He was harrassed and assaulted by police.

February 6 : The Iranian Football Federation banned seven female football [soccer] players for "gender ambiguity."
