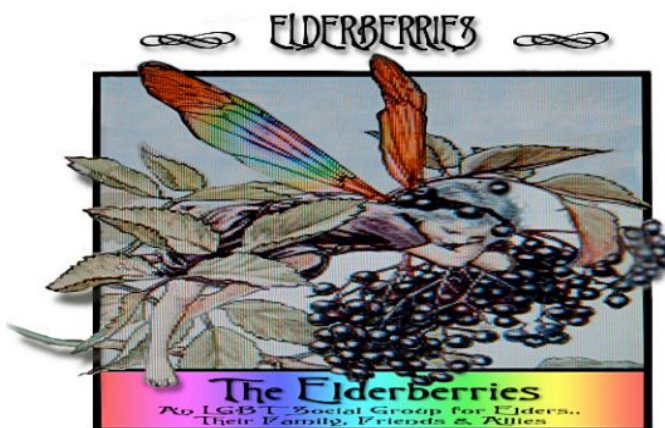

Patricia gave a stirring reading from her memoirs of the heroism shown during a tragic explosion at a shipyard in Bombay India, in World War II. She ended with a symbolic toast to the brave souls who lost their lives helping others.

Kirby spoke of family members who had served and the adventures and trauma they had to deal with. He showed photos of some of them.

Barend told of how his parents, from opposite ends of Europe, met in a guarded industrial complex outside of Berlin. They had harrowing experiences dealing with the Nazis and the Soviets. The toll it took on his family even decades later. He shared some photocopies to show, that related to their story.

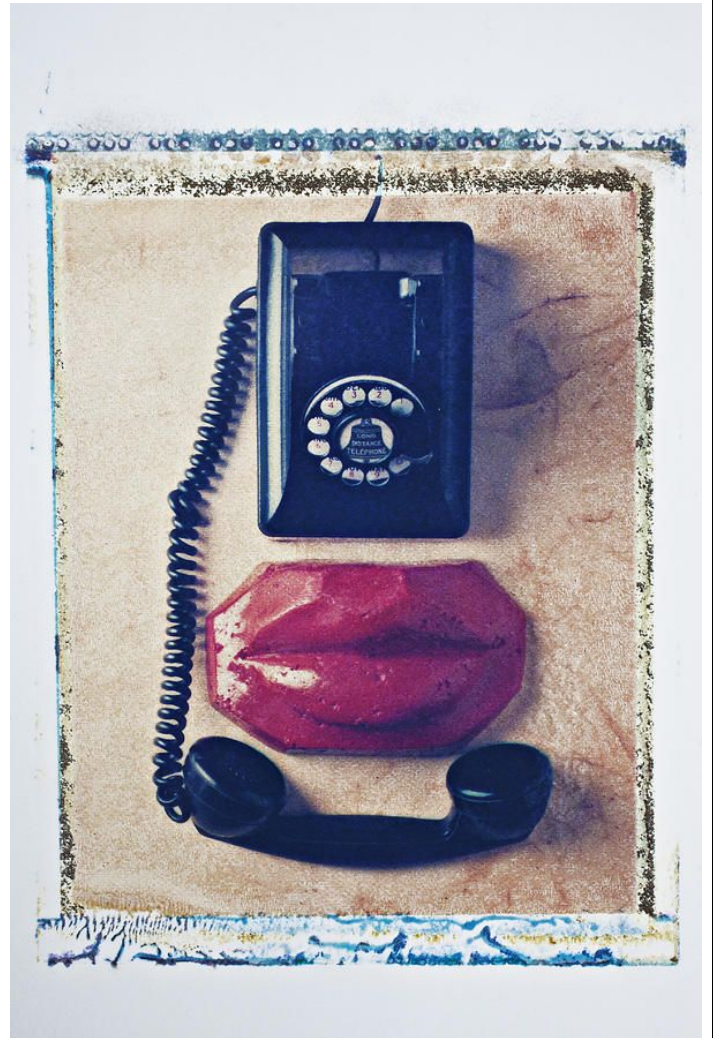
Hello Cherished Elderberry! We need someone to fill a currently unattended volunteer job.

On the evening of Monday, September 17, 2018, several Elderberries attended a presentation and discussion at the Central Library in Halifax. Hosted and moderated by Christine Saulnier of the Nova Scotia branch of the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives, the session was entitled "Reimagining Long-term Residential Care."

Three speakers presented their findings from a study got responses from three members of the local NS health community.

The study looked at care models and stresses



on the healthcare system, in particular when it comes to care for the elderly in long term care facilities. It focussed on staffing and the problems in the care management structure.

Along the same lines, if you can do oral history, there are several that need to be done for women in our community. There is funding for a stipend for these; same contact.

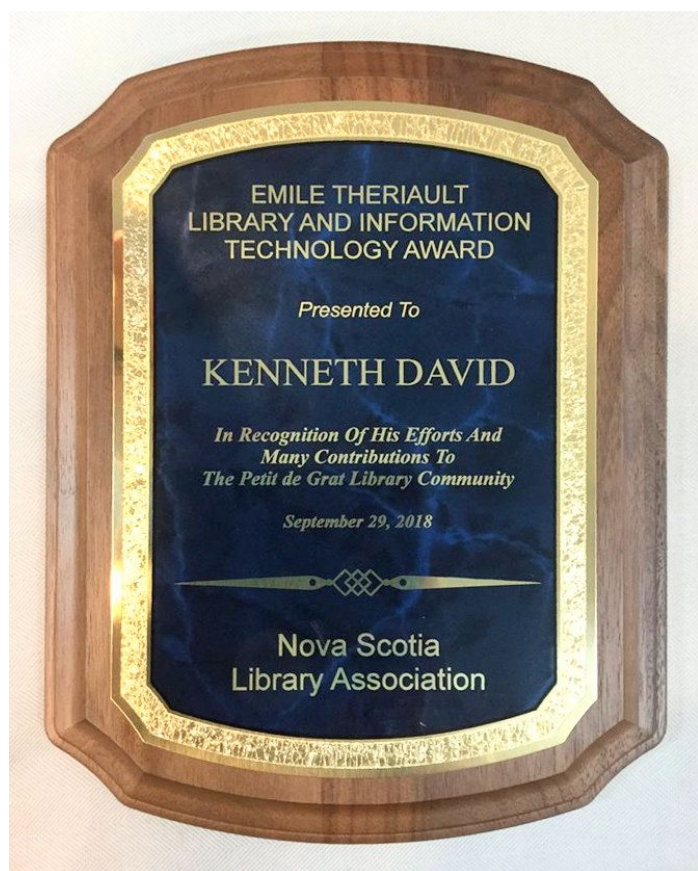


7 – Emile Theriault Award

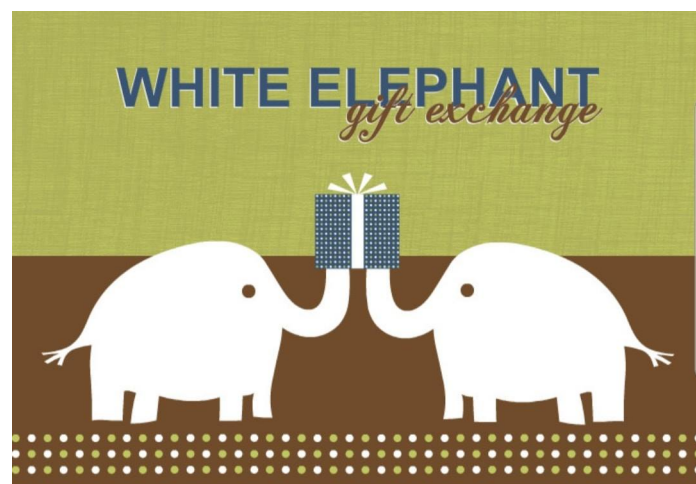

3 -- Wanted: Queer Woman

Hello,

I am writing to inquire about the possibility of speaking with someone (or multiple folks) on their experiences of being queer, female identifying folks who are dating in their senior years. I am a film maker in Halifax and am currently writing a project that is being supported by Telefilm about women's sexual health and the intersection with the western medical system.

One of our characters is a 73 year old widowed cis-gender queer woman who has started to date and has met a new partner who has unfortunately and unknowingly given her and STI. She has to face the prospect of speaking with a much younger, female doctor who has her own preconceived notions about older people and the gay community.

My hope would be to speak to someone who has had some aspect of this character as a lived experience themselves. I am happy to send you any additional information that I can about the production. The interviews are very casual, not recorded and kept entirely confidential. They are used only as an opportunity to learn, brainstorm, and go towards building more authentic voices for the characters.

Please let me know if there is anyone that would be interested in our project.
