5 September, 1952 - 14 February 2019 Everyone who was active at the beginning of an LGBT community in Halifax knew Mary Ann. She was magazine layout artist and editor of The Voice, Atlantic Canada's first gay newspaper, an addictions counsellor, member of GAE, Gays and Lesbians at Dalhousie and Sparrow. Ever the activist, she tirelessly participated in marches and protests, and attended the First Atlantic Conference and CGLRC National Conference and was on call with the Halifax Police to help with LGBT suicide calls.
