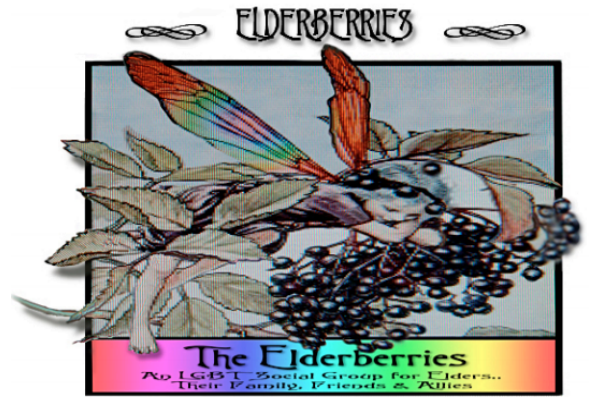

If you could register by replying to this email, it will help us plan the afternoon a bit better - and especially if you need some music played during your piece.

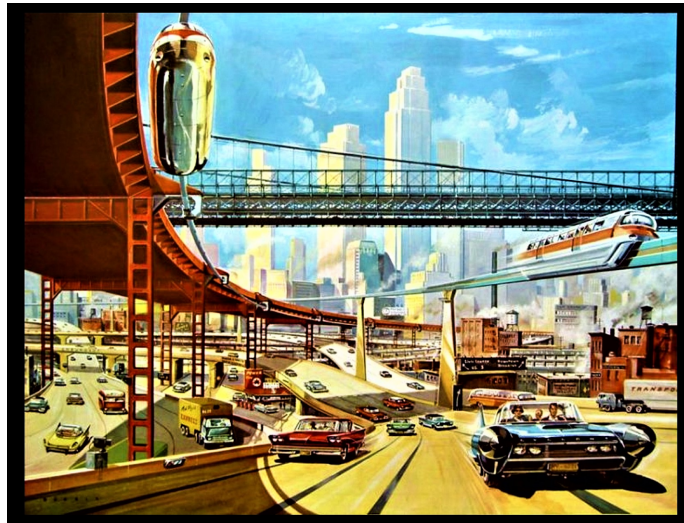
At: Radstorm, 2177 Gottingen Street, roughly across the street from where Menz Bar used to be.
