

Thank you, Venus Envy for helping in many ways with this, including lending us tables, being a dropoff for books, and printing beautiful bookmarks.




# 4. March: New By-Laws & AGM

For the last few months your Board has been meeting and talking about a new set of By-Laws to replace the template By-Laws we adopted when we first formed 13 years ago, with ones that more match the way we actually work. The By-Laws are the rules by which we run the Society - how meetings are run, how many people are needed to make decisions, who can be a member, etc etc. It's time to put those into place, and to do that, we need two things: 1) for you to see the new By-laws and 2) a Special General Meeting of the members to approve them. The Special General meeting and Annual General Meeting will be held at our regular Second Sunday Salon time on March 12th,

Then we'll have a special guest: local stained glass artist, illustrator and author Lynette Richards presenting her remarkable very local, very LGBT, graphic novel, *Call Me Bill*.

We'll send out a summary of the new By-Laws and a link to the full text in the next week or so.





### 5. 211 is for YOU!

Nova Scotia has a 211 service, to help people navigate all kinds of services and needs. They have several thousand listings curated by professional librarians. There are lots of resources of specific interest to elders... and yes, the Elderberries is there.

211 is not a government agency; it is coordinated mostly by the United Way. They had 64,000 calls last year.


The navigators who answer 211 are trained in solving complex problems, and to detect and ask about underlying needs - for example, someone calling about needing groceries may also need help with mental health or addiction issues
