1. April Second Sunday Salon


Where: Northwood. Use the 2630 Gottingen Street entrance

Program: Emily Davidson, founding member and President of the Turret Arts Space Society, will be speaking. The Salon is free and open to all. A longtime member of several organizations who devoted years to fundraising for support of the Turret Building (AKA the Khyber) and to saving it from demolition, Emily is a past Chair of the NSRAP and a past President of the NSCAD Students' Union.

In early March, the federal government announced a \$200,000 gift to the Turret Arts Space Society towards an "accessible downtown cultural hub." On March 27, the Province of Nova Scotia announced a further \$200,000 investment for the remediation and design of the 1888 vintage building.

3. March Brunch


