What: Bob Millar discusses and reads from his book, *Our German POW*, about gay love in WW 2. *And:* a perfunctory Annual General Meeting afterwards.

Karl, a young German soldier lived in Berlin in the 1930s, when his beloved American jazz and swing music was branded as decadent by the Nazis. He is a gay musician, who witnessed the end of liberal gay life in Berlin. As a POW, he develops an intimacy with Ian, the son of the farmer he works for. But things get complicated and dangerous.

The book is based on a real-life German POW who worked on a Scottish farm and became friends with some in the farming community – including Bob's father.

Bob is from Scotland and past president of the Halifax Gay Men's Chorus. He has a background in Marine Engineering. He's currently studying for an MFA (Master of Fine Arts) degree at the University of King's College, Halifax.

3. Elderberries + Advocates for the Care of the Elderly (ACE)

On January 11, Dan talked to the Advocates for the Care of the Elderly about the Elderberries. The identified ways we can work together are 1: A project to make it easy for residents and loved ones to report bigotry; 2: A project to do a reasonably well designed study to sniff for systemic transphobia, homophobia, bigotry, (and probably determine there is none) 3: An education program for Q folk to make items 1 & 2 very clear; 4: A project to have an explicit anti-bigotry module in PCW / CCA etc. training – for everyone who comes in contact with a resident; 5: And, maybe, the creation of a cultural "neighbourhood" for Q folk in LTC facilities. Possibly starting with, "what do they look like in big cities, other countries" and pitching that to Northwood.
