

She was adopted into a Winnipeg settler family, and knew nothing of her original family or cultural origins until her mid-thirties, when she found her birth mother and connected with her mother's people, the Metis.

By then Andrea lived in Nova Scotia, and was well known for singing with the legendary quartet *Four the Moment*.



3. August 28th Speakers Bureau and Social

On August 28, a social was held for both experienced and newly joining members of the Speakers' Bureau.

The purpose was both for new Speakers to review their role, and for future team members to become acquainted outside the school setting where most of our invitations originate.

Guest speaker Heather Perkins from Toastmasters talked about dealing with difficult or hostile questions, experienced members of the group chiming in with examples.

Pros and cons of "trigger warnings" were raised. Elderberries used these for several years, but recent research suggests they may do as much harm as good. This issue may need further examination.

Speakers enjoyed this event, but none of the hoped-for influx of new members appeared. Chair Nathan Elling, a retired



caterer, prepared a fine spread of internationally inspired refreshments, many ingredients harvested from his own garden. Thanks to volunteer Dave LeBlanc for his assistance.
