TO ALL THOSE IN ATTENDANCE AT THE G.A.E.GENERAL MEETING NOV 4th, 1981

The following is a proposeal that is forthcomming from myself, Chris Sheperd and Emerald Gibson who will collectively administer as a COMMITTEE the actual workings of implementation.

We propose that G.A.E.endorse the forming of our committee to handle the billetting of any <u>OUT OF TOWN</u> visitors, who request billetting for whatever reason (be it conferences, social or personal) while visiting Halifax.

We have a list of 38 names of people who have voluntered to host such billets and will screen all such volunters as to acceptability and services and accommodations to be provided. The names will then be put on a list and that list rotated so that no volunter host will be asked beyond his/her share.

We will have a questionaire to be submitted to G.A.E. (the Sec) which will give the billets' comments on his stay and his/her host(s).

Further, the host will be asked to comment for the record, on the billets; and general comments.

My phone number, 429-3204 will be the one used, as I have an answering machine, in any correspondence and advertising. Chris Sheperd will be provided a key to my apt, and can handle any calls that come in when I am not in Town due to work.

The maximum stay of a billet at any one host's place will be 2 nights and 3 days/unless arranged otherwise.

A report will also be submitted to each General meeting on any use or developments of this scheme, by me, in writing.

We ask for NO MONEY NOW, OR IN FUTURE, unless the membership of G.A.E. sees fit to advertise in some publications of their choice. The systewill be presented on a volunter bases only and any expenses borne by us (or me alone)

As I have been a billet host on a few occasions in the past and

AND I have never had any complaints or problems, I don't anticipate any problems developing now, IF the hosts are screened and billets made aware of all guidlines and the length of their stay.

This scheme IS NOT TO BE A DATING SERVICE!!!!!!!!!!

In the past few months, I've had occasion to talk with others from outside the Halifax-Dartmouth area, and it has been made clear to me that such a service, as proposed here, would be well received and used. It might result in more people comming to Halifax more frequently, spending more at the Turret, attending meetings of G.A.E. or consulting personally with the G.A.E. Executive personally for advice and problems in their areas or new organizations.

This service would greatly reduce the costs of anyone comming to Halifax, thereby putting such a trip within the reach of more people and to those perticularly who would not otherwise be able to afford it. at all, such as students or those on UIC, etc.

All that is asked by this proposeal, Is that the G.A.E. Membership endorse this Committee of 3 (mentioned before) and the idea contained as being worthwhile.
