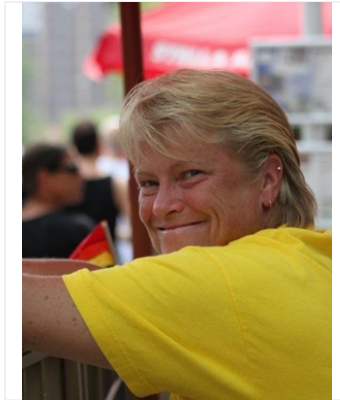


Krista SNOW (Kris)
